## Academic Monitoring Plan for Graduate Students on Academic Probation

As a result of your academic performance, you have been placed on academic probation; a stop has been placed on your record which will prevent you from registering for classes next semester. In order to lift this stop, you must work with your graduate deputy to develop an academic plan to get back into good academic standing (a cumulative GPA above 3.0). Once you are placed on probation, you must return to good academic standing within twelve credits or you will be dismissed from the graduate program. Furthermore, while on academic probation you must maintain a term GPA of at least 3.0 (or you will be dismissed from the graduate program). Both your graduate deputy and the College are committed to working with you to improve your academic standing.
